Please be aware that any grant that brings in less than 15% in indirect costs (IDC) will need to be supplemented up to the 15% equivalent by existing investigator or departmental sundry funds. Resolution of this issue must occur prior to submitting a proposal. Training fellowships from foundations, public charity, and non-profit organizations are excluded from this minimum IDC requirement.

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1. George C. Cotzias, M.D. Memorial Fellowships, American Parkinson Disease Association (APDA)

Dr. George C. Cotzias was a pathfinder in the pharmacologic exploration of brain functions and in the treatment of Parkinson's disease with levodopa. His work stimulated much of the current interest and research on the problems of the neurological movement disorders. It is to honor the memory of the late Dr. Cotzias and to stimulate young neurologists to follow his leadership that The American Parkinson Disease Association has established the George C. Cotzias Fellowship.

The Dr. George C. Cotzias Memorial Fellowship is intended to assist promising young neurologist in establishing careers in research, teaching and patient care relevant to the problems, causes, prevention, diagnosis and treatment of Parkinson's disease and related neurological movement disorders.

Eligibility requirements (partial list):

- The applicant must be a physician who is licensed to practice medicine in the US and who is completing, or has completed, training in a clinical discipline concerned with disorders of the nervous system.
- The applicant should be an instructor or assistant professor and demonstrate a clear commitment to the goal described above.
- The applicant should be no more than 10 years beyond completion of his/her clinical training at the time of submission.

- Awardees should not be a recipient of a career development award at the time of initial Sojourns Scholar program funding (e.g., NIH K award, VA career award, National Palliative Care Research Center award, or other funded career award).

6. Translational Research Program, Jeffrey Modell Foundation

Primary Immunodeficiencies occur when components of the immune system are missing or do not function properly, causing hyper-susceptibility to infection and in some cases severe autoimmunity, IBD, and respiratory diseases. Advancing research that enhances our understanding of the immune system represents one of the single greatest strategies that biomedical science has to offer to identify new therapies and will greatly benefit those with Primary Immunodeficiencies and the millions that remain undiagnosed.

The purposes of this program are:

- To support innovative and novel investigations in Primary Immunodeficiency, focusing on translational research leading to meaningful clinical application.
- To advance the growing knowledge of genotype-phenotype correlations and gain a better understanding of the underlying mechanisms of immune function and dysfunction.
- To support research that will lead to advancement in clinical recognition, diagnostic tools, and innovative therapies that will impact overall health outcomes and improve the quality of life of those affected by Primary Immunodeficiency.
- Grants with the following focus will be strongly considered for awards:
 - 1. Novel PI defects
 - 2. Innovativeness in early diagnosis
 - 3. Treatment advances to a cure
 - 4. Impact on patient health (i.e. how a patient will benefit)
 - 5. Reach of the proposed project (i.e. how many patients might benefit)

7. PEACE Grants, Mind & Life Institute

This funding mechanism supports projects that advance our understanding of wholesome mental qualities and positive interpersonal and social action related to Prosociality, Empathy, Altruism, Compassion, and Ethics (PEACE). With this program, we invite rigorous interdisciplinary research proposals that examine one or more of the following:

- practices, methods, or interventions that may cultivate PEACE qualities,
- basic mechanisms (psychological, physiological, social, developmental, etc.) underlying PEACE qualities and their growth, and
- the development of measures to rigorously assess PEACE qualities in various contexts (both in the laboratory and in the real world).
- While projects do not need to have an immediate applied component, applicants should make clear how the proposed research could support positive action in the world. In addition, we have a special interest in supporting such research on PEACE qualities in relation to three broad topic areas:
- Personal Well-being—Examining how to nurture positive emotions, including love, compassion, gratitude, and forgiveness, and the impact of negative emotions such as fear, anger, and anxiety in our lives.
- Compassionate Communities—Examining how the inner workings of the mind influence the formation of the views, behaviors, and social systems that separate us, and the role of contemplative practice in creating more compassionate communities.
- Human-Earth Connection—Investigating how the union of contemplative wisdom and science can lead to greater awareness of the interconnectedness of all life—and action to support and sustain both individuals and the earth's living systems

10. General Research Grant, Oncology Nursing Society (ONS) Foundation

The purpose of the grant is to support rigorous scientific oncology nursing research. Research projects may include investigator-initiated research, pilot or feasibility studies, supplements to current funded projects, or developing a new aspect of a program of research. Funding preference is given to projects that involve nurses in the design and conduct of the research activity and that promote theoretically based oncology practice.

The following areas in need of oncology nursing research articulated in the ONS Research Agenda are:

- Symptom Science in Immunotherapy and Emerging Therapies in Precision Health and Biosignatures
- Health Disparities
- Palliative and Psychosocial Oncology Care

Eligibility requirements (partial list):

- The principal investigator must be a registered nurse actively involved in some aspect of cancer patient care, education, or research and be PhD or DNSc prepared (only one PI can appear on the grant).
- At least one member of the research team must have received and completed research study funding of at least \$100,000 as PI.

11. Clinical Research, ResMed Foundation

The Foundation's key mission is to promote novel research as well as public and physician awareness of sleep disordered breathing (SDB), with a primary focus on positive airway pressure therapies and ventilation-based treatments. The Foundation will consider proposals focused on the evaluation, diagnosis, treatment and management of SDB and other respiratory disorders. Research areas of interest are also other morbidities that are associated with SDB which include cardiovascular disease, metabolic syndrome, diabetes and morbid obesity. In the cardiovascular area, there is a particular emphasis on hypertension, coronary artery disease, heart failure, and atrial fibrillation. Other areas of focus are: SDB in conjunction with occupational health safety, asthma and anesthesiology; chronic obstructive pulmonary disease; and, pregnancy/preeclampsia. Specific focus is on outcomes that can influence clinical practice in the near term.

The Foundation is also interested in the application of novel screening and diagnostic tools to identify more easily SDB/OSA, as well as new and better paradigms to improve patient adherence and compliance with positive airway pressure and ventilation-based treatment methods.

12. DxQI Seed Grant Program, Society to Improve Diagnosis in Medicine (SIDM)

Research has demonstrated that diagnostic errors are the most common, catastrophic and, costly of all causes of preventable medical harm. In fact, errors in diagnosis are the most frequent cause of medical error reported by patients.

Given the magnitude of diagnostic error burden, SIDM advocates for increased attention by health systems to improving the quality of their diagnostic process. This goes beyond avoiding errors and includes consideration of accuracy, timeliness, cost, and patient convenience. Designing an optimal diagnostic process will require a careful balancing among these competing demands. Given the dearth of solutions, we believe catalyzing a "bottom up" approach, whereby frontline health professionals and patients are engaged to develop and test plausible solutions, will most likely produce the best outcomes.

Over the course of three years, grants will be awarded in the following categories:

- The Big Three (vascular events, infections, and cancers). 40% of awards
- Diagnostic Quality Disparities: Proposals that seek to reduce the risk of diagnostic error
 or delayed treatment and improve diagnostic quality outcomes related to health
 disparities associated with age, race/ethnicity, sex, and/or other social determinants of
 health. 40% of awards
- Open: Topics that do not address one of the previous two areas. Up to 20% of awards
