Please be aware that any grant that brings in less than **15% in indirect costs (IDC)** will need to be supplemented up to the 15% equivalent by existing investigator or departmental sundry funds. Resolution of this issue must occur prior to submitting a proposal. Training fellowships from foundations, public charity, and non-profit organizations are excluded from this minimum IDC requirement.

1. ABSM Junior Faculty Research Award, American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM)/American Sleep Medicine Foundation (ASMF)

With the development of this program, the ASMF seeks to provide research training for young faculty members who wish to pursue careers as physician scientists in sleep medicine. This grant program is funded primarily by the ABSM endowment.

Factors that will be taken into consideration include the applicant's experience, presence of resources necessary to complete the study (including the commitment and experience of any mentor that has been established to assist with career development), feasibility and scientific merit of the research plan, training plan/environment, appropriateness of the proposed research/training activities to the ASMF mission and anticipated relationship between the funds provided and expected outcomes, including potential contribution of this work to the development of the applicant's academic career in sleep medicine, and degree of institutional support evident in the application.

Award Amount: \$75,000 paid over 2 years

Indirect Costs: 8%

The Career Development Grants Program includes the following grants:

- Carl W. Gottschalk Research Scholar Grant- Given to a general nephrology investigator.
- John Merrill Grant in Transplantation- Given to an investigator performing biomedical research related to transplantation.
- Norman Siegel Research Scholar Grant- Given to a pediatric investigator.

3. DMRF Clinical Fellowship Training Program, Dystonia Medical Research Foundation (DMRF)

The Foundation (DMRF) is pleased to offer one-year clinical fellowships to support the training of exceptionally qualified physicians in preparation for their clinical and/or research career in movement disorders with emphasis on dystonia and a special competence in use of botulinum toxins.

The fellowship should focus on training in both the clinical evaluation and care of patients with dystonia and the conduct of clinical research on dystonia. The training must be patient-oriented and include hands-on experience in clinics as well as participation in professional meetings and workshops. Involvement in the activities of the Dystonia Coalition and participation in courses related to dystonia at major neurological meetings will also be expected.

Award Amount: \$75,000 for 1 year
