Please be aware that any grant that brings in less than **15% in indirect costs (IDC)** will need to be supplemented up to the 15% equivalent by existing investigator or departmental sundry funds. Resolution of this issue must occur prior to submitting a proposal. Training fellowships from foundations, public charity, and non-profit organizations are excluded from this minimum IDC requirement.

1. ASLMS Research Grant Program, American Society for Laser Medicine and Surgery (ASLMS)

The American Society for Laser Medicine and Surgery (ASLMS) supports research projects designed to foster the development and use of lasers and other related technologies in medical and surgical applications. While the best research projects will be given priority for funding, a concerted effort will be made to award a balance of basic science and clinical research.

The primary purpose of the ASLMS Research Grant Program is to conduct research which can be applied to medical and surgical care of patients. Preference will be given to proposed research projects which have a direct implication for medical or surgical applications. While the best research projects will be given priority, a concerted effort will be made to award a balance of basic science and clinical research.

6. Research Grants, Bryon Riesch Paralysis Foundation

The goal of the Bryon Riesch Paralysis Foundation is to provide grants to fund research in the hopes of finding a cure for paralysis. The intent of these grants is to promote new and exciting research in the field of paralysis. The amount of grant money distributed is pre-determined by the Bryon Riesch Paralysis Foundation (BRPF) Board of Directors. The following areas of research are of primary interest to the Bryon Riesch Paralysis Foundation:

- Factors relating to re-myelination, axonal preservation or growth, and cell differentiation that may lead to acute or chronic recovery in spinal cord injured individuals.
- Drug therapies or other interventions that will limit secondary damage after a spinal cord injury.
- Activities that investigate underlying problems associated with neurological disorders such as spasticity, chronic pain, bladder/bowel function, or sexual function.

Award Amount: The grant provided is good for one-year periods and may be renewed at the discretion of the BRPF. The grant amount will be based upon availability of BRPF funds and will be determined by the Foundation.

7. Research Grants, Desmoid Tumor Research Foundation (DTRF)

The Desmoid Tumor Research Foundation, Inc. ("DTRF") funds research that will advance the current scientific knowledge about desmoid tumors, moving toward the development of new treatment options and the ultimate goal of a cure.

DTRF is the only foundation in the world dedicated to facilitating and funding research for a cure for desmoid tumors. The foundation funds research that uses cutting-edge science and creative clinical applications, in addition to novel approaches addressing potential leads based on prior research.

Research proposals with additional sources of funding support are particularly desirable. Researchers must be willing to collaborate with other scientists and institutions with similar interests. Grantees must agree to participate as reviewers in DTRF's future grant review cycle, as well as to exert best efforts to attend the annual fall International DTRF Desmoid Tumor Research Workshop.

The awardees will have already established a track record in the field of heart or lung transplantation, the failing heart or lungs or mechanical circulatory support and will aim to further develop their career in one of these areas.

The results of funded research must be submitted in one of the following formats within three years of the initial date of funding:

- as a manuscript to the Journal of Heart and Lung Transplantation
- as an abstract for the ISHLT Annual Meeting and Scientific Sessions

In line with NPF's mission, Bridge Grants will provide an important life-line

to help support long-term careers of psoriatic disease researchers who will go on to make discoveries that bring us closer to a cure for psoriatic disease and improve patients' lives.

Applications related to all aspects of psoriatic disease are strongly encouraged, including basic science, translational research, technology, epidemiology, health services, and clinical research. Prospective applicants are encouraged to re view recent publications and reports identifying research gaps and priorities in psoriatic disease research.
